The Children's Aid Society established its Health Care Access Program (HCAP) in 1998 to help children and families successfully enroll in New York's government-sponsored health insurance programs: Medicaid, Child Health Plus, and Family Health Plus. This program, funded by the New York State Department of Health, guides New York City families and individuals through the application process from start to finish, ensuring that all eligible applicants receive coverage.

HCAP's Enrollment Counselors advise clients on their eligibility status, facilitate the application and enrollment process with hands-on case management, and work with Quality Control Associates to ensure coverage for eligible clients. They are fluent in English, Spanish, Cantonese, Mandarin, Korean, Chinese, Taishanese, Vietnamese, Khmer (Cambodian), Fujianese, Fuzhouese, Hakka, Hainanese and Toisanese.

Need health insurance?

New York State has several Public Health Insurance programs:

- Children can qualify for Medicaid or Child Health Plus B, depending on income and family size. Most children in New York qualify, regardless of immigration status.
- Adults age 19-64 can qualify for Medicaid or Family Health Plus.

Benefits covered by these programs:

- Regular Checkups
- In / Outpatient Hospital Care
- Prescription Medication
- Vaccinations
- Dental Care
- Emergency Care
- Mental Health Care
- Vision, Speech and Hearing Services

How do I know if I qualify?

Call us at the locations listed and we can prescreen you to see which programs you may qualify for. We will need to know about your income, family size, and immigration status. You can also call the HCAP hotline at 212-503-6804.

I don't have time to go to the Medicaid office and wait for hours!

No problem! No need to go the Medicaid Office. We offer:

- Convenient hours and locations
- Service in about 30 minutes

What documents do I need?

- Proof of address (Utility bill, lease, or postmarked envelope)
- Proof of ID/Immigration status (Birth certificate with photo ID, passport, green card, or work permit)
- Social Security cards (if available)
- Proof of income (Pay stubs, unemployment, child support, self-employment, or letter of support)
You do not need to be working to qualify.
